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Hello everyone!

It is always a great pleasure to continue ANAK's adventure. Many events have taken place this year and we are happy to share them with you through our 2019 newsletter!

A new coordinator, **Ketut Sumara**, now lives at Anak's residence in Singaraja with the teenagers that we are sponsoring. He also supervises and offers daily support to these young people so as to encourage them and motivate them towards their graduation.

We have «opened» a new village called Pacung in Tejakula, where six children now have godparents: one high school student, two middle school students and three primary school pupils. A field coordinator, Bapak **Ciwik**, is helping us by supervising these children in this village.

We also organised a workshop on «**Preventing Child Abuse**» at schools in Pakisan and Amed. We are planning to offer it to all the villages where ANAK is involved, in the schools and in the «Banjar» for adults.

This year, we have added new children for godparenting from the six villages where ANAK works. Many young people are now in high school and some live at ANAK's residence (41 teenagers). Consequently, we are now able to welcome new children at primary school and help them from the very beginning of their education.

This year, too, we were able to organise the annual school outing for all our godparented children as well as the children who regularly participate in ANAK's extracurricular activities. This took place at the Bedugul Botanical Garden. We were really glad, not only to see the children so happy, but also that all of us were able to go to Bedugul to participate in the games we had prepared.

In 2019, our priority is to make progress on the construction of Dharma Cita 2, the second residence for high school girls! Thank you all again for your generosity and your involvement, without which none of this would be possible!

On behalf of the Balinese children, as well as ANAK's teams in Bali, France, Switzerland and Luxembourg, we wish you a «**Merry Christmas and Happy New Year 2019**».

THE BIRTH OF ANAK LUXEMBOURG IN 2019

At the beginning of 2019, the Luxembourg branch of Anak will be created and registered with the Luxembourg government authorities. All of Anak's teams welcome this new group to the association.

THE RISKS OF THE AGUNG VOLCANO ERUPTION



In November 2017, Bali was much in the news due to the awakening of the Gunung Agung volcano. Residents in the eruption-risk area were obliged to leave their homes, and tourism, the main source of income in the area, suddenly stopped. Four of Anak's godchildren went to live with relatives residing in a secure area. Residents with no family elsewhere were relocated to relief camps set up by the Indonesian government, mainly in the Karangasem region. To help them, Anak set up an online kitty that was used to buy staple foods for 29 families and ten elderly ladies living on their own, thus enabling them to feed themselves for more than a week. The Anak team also brought donations of clothing, games and notebooks etc. for children in the camps.

STAFF - IN BALI

We welcome Ketut Sumara, coordinator at Dharma Cita.

We have had a youth coordinator at DHARMA CITA, Anak's residence in Singaraja, since March 2018. His name is Ketut Sumara and he comes from Bontihing, a neighbouring village of Pakisan.

He worked at a 5-star hotel in Jimbaran after having studied the appropriate courses. He is 22 years old, married, and has a one-and-a-half-year-old daughter. His family lives in Bontihing, 45 minutes from ANAK's residence.

In view of his young age, we asked P2TP2A (the Integrated Service Centre for the Empowerment of Women and Children) to assess his skills and psychological stability. We are confident that he is able to manage our teenagers. Ketut Sumara shows a great maturity acquired through the obstacles that he has overcome. He enjoys his job as a coordinator and lives on-site with the teenage godchildren. He is close to the young people, yet provides the seriousness required to organise the residence. The Anak teams are thrilled that he is working with the young people.

Ciwik, coordinator of our new centre in Tejakula

In July 2018, we opened a new centre in the village of Pacung Tejakula. We support six children there: one high school student, two middle school students and three primary pupils. On the advice of a P2TP2A employee, we studied the situation and discovered that very few people in this village had completed high school and that none of them had gone to university.

We then met with Komang Kiwi Jaya (aka CIWIK) several times. He is a plumber and a dancer in the village who, after several interviews, became the coordinator of Pacung in July.

An active member in France: Françoise Lagardère

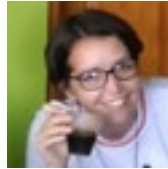
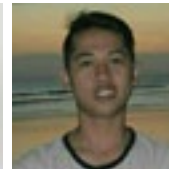

ANAK'S GENERAL ASSEMBLIES IN FRANCE AND SWITZERLAND

The General Assembly of Anak France took place in Paris on April 14, 2018 while that of Anak Switzerland was held in Geneva on May 12. The 2017 accounts were reviewed and the 2018 budgets were voted on. We also held elections for the new Board of Directors and Anak France's Office. Regarding Anak Switzerland, the statutes were slightly modified to meet the requirements of the Canton of Geneva. Projects for 2018 were reviewed and voted on unanimously. In France, despite the SNCF strikes, several godmothers and godfathers attended and were interested in various projects in Bali. These meetings enabled friendly conversations among the members present and we hope to see more of you at the next GAs, which will take place in March and May 2019 respectively.

PRODUCTION OF THE MAMA CHRISTINE DOCUMENTARY



Sandrine CHOPIN and her filming team came to Bali to shoot a documentary about the founder of Anak, MAMA CHRISTINE!

They then produced a 26-minute film, which reveals how, in the north of Bali, the meeting between a young child and a French businesswoman changed the fate of several hundred impoverished children.

It is a portrait of Christine Grosso, a daring and generous woman who embarked on a marvellous human and

humanitarian adventure.

The film was screened at the cinema in Paris on May 31 and has been presented at several international and French festivals. It is also broadcast at events in which Anak participates.

RAJA PEOPLE AWARD - JUNE 2018

This year, the Raja Danièle Marcovici Foundation, which financially supports the schooling of ten of our girls, contributed towards our project to build the Dharma Cita 2 residence, noting it as one of the year's best projects.

The prize awarded to us was 6,700 euros!

THE EVENING OF 4 JULY 2018 IN LYON

Jérôme and Laurence Gagneux and their team organised a Balinese charity event to benefit Anak by opening the doors of their restaurant: Le Petit Meunier. The evening was dedicated to discovering Bali and its flavours as well as the wonders of its culture and dances. Donations collected during this evening were given to Anak.





MONTRETOUT DE SAINT-CLOUD SCHOOL

An unusual means of communication was organised between a class of elementary pupils at this school and Anak students: drawings were exchanged enabling communication between one side of the planet and the other! We thank Jérôme Rivkine and his daughter Joanne for initiating this wonderful project.

On Saturday 22 June, the school represented Anak at its fair, which raised over 500 euros from donations and the sale of objects. Clothing donations were also made. The students' stand also included an exhibition of drawings by our children from Sawan in Bali and these were used to present the association.

THE EVENING OF 12 OCTOBER 2018 IN BRUSSELS

Alix Glorieux organised an evening in Brussels to present Anak and Balinese culture. The donations collected during this event will fund the construction of our new girls' residence, Dharma Cita 2.



112 AND 13 OCTOBER 2018 IN PARIS - FESTIVAL DES VILLES ET MUSIQUES DU MONDE

Anak was present and represented at this festival held at the Zingaro Theatre in Aubervilliers. It was a great opportunity to exchange ideas and meet with others, to present our message and share our energy.

From 20 to 22 April 2018, Les équipes de **Rotaract**, an association run by young people aged 18 to 30 (students and young working people), organised a weekend for 150 people. They took the opportunity to present Anak and to organise a collection (of toys, etc.) by asking each participant to bring something special to the event. 50 kg of donations were collected and will be sent to Bali in the coming weeks!

9 ANAK MAIL - GIFT MANAGEMENT



Dear godparents,

To award your godchildren for their schoolwork or to motivate them, you usually offer a gift.

We suggest that you limit the amount of gifts to 2 million IDR (about €130) over the year, including cash and the value of gifts. In fact, for the most part, the children who lose their motivation for school the quickest are those who often receive large gifts from their godparents over the year.

However, godparents may donate more than €130 during the year in cases of emergency after a disaster (house destroyed by a storm, earthquake, flood, landslide, etc.) and/or expensive health expenses not covered by the local health insurance (only some care is covered).

ANAK'S POSTMAN REMINDER: Do you have room in your suitcases? Our teams can give you real time routing possibilities or share requests from other godparents regarding the delivery of gifts. Please let us know when

you might be coming to Bali as well as your requests for parcel deliveries and we will try our best to make suitcases available to help you. Kindly contact us at: smottet.anak@free.fr.

Sandrine is a nurse and as she is unable to practice in Bali, she shares her skills with us as a volunteer. Thanks to her generosity, every Anak centre has a complete first aid kit adapted to the needs of the children. In addition, during distributions, Sandrine goes with the team and examines children's "booboos" for a more regular monitoring and connections are made. She runs awareness-raising workshops on hygiene and first aid for all of Anak's children.

Suzanne, an American English teacher at the Green School in Ubud, visited Anak's centres twice during the spring of 2018. She first came to Sawan to speak English with the children and to discuss pedagogy with Gede Artama, Arni and Komang. She then came to Dharma Cita for an «English only» weekend during which high school students were able to chat with a native English speaker and improve their English through fun activities and games. They had this message for her «Thank you Suzanne, it was so good to learn with you, we hope to see you soon again!»





MARINE PARTAGE

The school ship DIXMUD travels the world and, as part of MARINE PARTAGE, offers to bring associations' donations to their destination. Consequently, on 27 April 2018, Maya and Dwi picked up 180kg of donations collected by volunteers of ANAK France from the port of Benoa. Our thanks go to the members of MARINE PARTAGE for organising the ship, to Stéphane Mottet for taking care of the logistics in France, and to Véronique Allix and the Sainte Thérèse School for their donations of towels, sheets and second-hand clothing.

My name is Kadek Sukrawan, but they call me Désu. I am the youngest child of two and come from a disadvantaged family. As a child, I helped my parents at a small business in which my mother worked, so that they could fulfil my wish to attend primary school.

I was in fact able to go to primary school. I became aware of ANAK when I was in CM1 (US Grade 4, UK year 5). Being sponsored by the association has brought me many positive changes and activities, as well as, for example, the opportunity to take courses in computer science, English and other activities. I once believed I could only continue my studies up to high school level, but thanks to ANAK I was able to study for a degree in tourism.

I feel very lucky and happy to be sponsored by ANAK, and I especially thank my god-mother who voluntarily put money aside to help me continue my training up to the level I obtained. It helped me a great deal and lightened the financial burden for my family. I was not a gifted student at school, but I was able to attend classes together with those who seemed smarter, because I have a motto: "success does not belong to those who are smart and intelligent. Success belongs to those who have dreams and struggle to reach them."

I am now 25 years old and I work in a company called Bestari Jaya as a coordinating adviser. My role is to coordinate and supervise team work. My current job doesn't really match my training but it's not a problem for me because I believe that our work success, no matter what work it is, depends on us. Thanks to my work, I have gained experience. In the past, I was only able to see foreigners from afar, but now I can communicate with them. I even have friends from outside Indonesia.

I would like to express my gratitude to ANAK and its team. I hope that in the future, the association will continue to help disadvantaged children, because there are children everywhere who want to study.

13 INTERVIEW WITH MUDARINI

Initially, Anak collected donations for potential scholarship students in the village of Pakisan. I was one of those who received a scholarship for underprivileged children and I was very happy to receive it. I was then in CM1 (grade 4 US, year 5 UK) and my family could not finance my needs or my studies.

In addition to rice and monthly pocket money, I also received extra help for my family so that we could improve our economic situation. We were given pigs to raise. When I went to middle school, I continued to receive the scholarship as well as pocket money, equipment and school uniforms on a regular basis. While I was in middle school, the association built a centre in our village and we then had various activities aimed at providing scholarship students with additional skills: classes in English, dance, computer studies, reading at the library, etc.

This scholarship allowed me to continue my studies in higher education at the technical college. I chose to study fashion at technical college 2 in Singaraja. During my studies, I was provided with a room, meals and pocket money up until I completed my courses. The association also often organised additional training for me and my fellow scholarship students. After I graduated from technical college, the association financed my sewing classes for four months. Anak also enabled me to provide myself with a sewing workshop so as to practice my skills within the association. After I finished my courses, I was hired by one of the tailors in Singaraja. I am now financially independent and can help my family. All of this was possible thanks to Anak's support. I am very grateful to Anak for having financed my studies and my needs during my schooling.

JULIANNE became a Partner of Anak through her company **COMPTOIRS DES EXPLORATEURS** (EXPLORERS' COUNTERS)



«My name is Julianne, I'm 31 years old and I live in the South of France. I have just left my job in order to start a business in importing furniture and decorative objects from Bali. Our project is going

well but some essentials are missing. I am not interested in merely bringing back a container to sell its contents. I believe that, at my level, I can do more to help those who need it most, the most innocent and vulnerable, children... I think of ANAK, an association I discovered a few months earlier on the internet. It seems trustworthy and serious, but how can I be sure when I am thousands of kilometres away? I call Maya, a friend of my brother, who lives in Bali. I know she is a volunteer and I need her opinion, her experience in the field. She laughs when I ask her, and explains that she has been working for ANAK for two years. I see a glimpse then of my destiny: the coincidence cannot be ignored, and I arrange to meet her when I am next on the island of the gods. A few weeks later, here I am driving with her and Dwi to deliver materials to the three centres that the association manages in the North of the island... We spend the night at the high school student centre in Singaraja. I meet about forty young people, aged 14 to 17, all from disadvantaged families. ANAK helps to guide them in their future. Regular schooling (primary school, middle school, high school, and university) seems normal and traditional to us Westerners, but here, due to the high cost that schooling entails, far too many children have no chance to learn

under favourable circumstances and this is where ANAK steps in. The team is involved in everything (tuition, school-bags, uniforms, pocket money, housing for those that live far away, laptops and scooters to get around, etc.).

I visit the centre and discover the environment in which these young people develop into responsible adults. The basics of community living that they learn here are respect for others, sharing and honesty. The atmosphere is peaceful, serene and a little outside of real time. I note the great big smiles on their faces when they come and welcome us; their eyes are full of gratitude and kindness. The evening finds them studious in anticipation of future exams but we hear laughter and singing in the girls' dormitories.

The next day, we go and visit the land that the association has just bought so as to construct a new centre that will be bigger, more functional and, most especially, unencumbered by a rental lease... We are already preparing a new future here!

I am so appreciative of the involvement and the work that the facilitators and coordinators carry out in the field so as to give all of these children the best chances of success.

As I write these lines, I think of Gandhi's famous words «Be the change you want to see in the world.» Congratulations to ANAK for everything you have managed to put into place here for these children. Bravo also to the godparents and donors, because without you, nothing would be possible. Finally, a huge thank you to Maya and Dwi for the two days of conversation and sharing...I return to France with a heart full of beautiful moments spent with you.

Over these past ten years, Dési has had very good academic results, which we followed very regularly (by receiving her report cards and letters to godparents) and has always been grateful for the chance that she has had in being able to study.

Today, this little girl has become a very beautiful, intelligent and sweet young woman who, after having had a very successful school career, has chosen to work as a beautician at a spa in her region in order to stay close to her parents and siblings.

Of course, we stayed in touch with her, and last May, during a visit to BALI, it was with great emotion that we met again, surrounded by her family and, of course, our friend, DWI.

We thank the entire ANAK team for their commitment towards the children and their families by giving them hope for a better future.

Thank you for enabling us to participate in this great adventure and thank you to future ANAK godparents for choosing to become part of this great family.

Finally, I will quote a well-known phrase of Nelson MANDELA: «Education is the most powerful weapon ... you can use to change the world.»



TESTIMONIAL OF MRS. NI KETUT MULYANI

I have been Putri Astiti's godmother since May 2016 when she was still in CM1 (Grade 4 US, year 5 UK), but it was on Friday 15 June 2018 that I met her for the first time, after she had graduated from middle school. I arrived at Putri's house with my family (my husband and children) and was greeted by her great-grandmother, because Putri was at the village chief's office making documents.

When she arrived, my first impression of her was that she was a very polite, kind and intelligent girl. She seemed confident even though she no longer had parents. When we talked about her future study plans, she said that she wanted to continue at the technical college in order to study beauty care. I also happened to glance at her room and saw that she slept without a bed or mattress - only on a mat. I was moved and had tears in my eyes. To me, she is a very strong 15-year-old girl. Ever since she was small, she has been selling cakes from door to door every day after school to help in the expenses of her family's home.



17 GET INVOLVED – PROJECTS IN BALI



Over four days in 2018, Anak organised child abuse prevention workshops in Pakisan and Amed: on 12 July at SD* 1 and 3 Pakisan, on 13 July at SD 4 Pakisan and SMPN* 4 Kubutambahan at Pakisan, on 18 July at SD 3, SD 5 and SD 7 Bunutan, and on 20 July at SD 2, SD 4 Bunutan and SMPN 3 Abang in Bunutan. The presenters at Pakisan were part of the P2KBP3A (Pengendalian Penduduk, Keluarga Berencana, Pemberdayaan Perempuan dan Perlindungan Anak/Population Control, Family Planning, Women's Empowerment and Child Protection) government agency, while those at Amed were part of the KPPAD (Komisi Penyelenggara Perlindungan Anak Daerah/Regional Committee for Child Protection) in Denpasar.

During the one-hour sessions at each school, presenters showed cartoons indicating those areas of the body that may be touched and those that may not, except by a doctor during a medical examination. The presenters also explained to the children the importance of confiding in someone if anything should happen to them.

The school principals thanked us for organising this workshop and asked us to present it once a year, at the beginning of the school year.

*SD: Sekolah Dasar = primary school

*SMPN: Sekolah Menengah Pertama Negeri = middle school



As a result of the Agung volcano eruption, families were obliged to go and live in a relief camp near the Anak DHARMA CITA residence. Consequently, in December 2017, the high school students spent a day at the Air Saneh camp to organise games with the children in the camp. They brought with them donated clothing, books and linen, which were so useful for these families.



The **travelling library** is once again on the road and Lotong is driving! Anak's travelling library has been on the road again since January 2018! Lotong, a volunteer at the Pakisan centre, makes a twice-weekly run to the villages surrounding Pakisan, enabling children to access reading... much to their enjoyment!



CORRESPONDENCE WITH THE SAINT CLOUD SCHOOL

After Joanne's visit to Anak (see Anak's Newsletter No. 25) and at the instigation of her parents and school teachers, her school became a corresponding partner with children at the LILA CITA centre in Sawan. This project began in May 2018 with a first exchange of drawings between Balinese and French children. It was an opportunity for children from both hemispheres to share their culture, their environment and their lives through their drawings. We hope that this partnership will continue and will allow an exchange of letters in English as a second step!anglais !

RENOVATION and the Internet

In February 2018, the Buddhi Cita (Pakisan) and Lila Cita Amed centres were renovated. The internet was installed at Lila Cita Amed enabling our team to work more efficiently and providing the children with the chance to benefit from more comprehensive computer courses.

19 A YOGA COURSE FOR THE CHILDREN

In October 2017, Didier Dozias, a friend of Anak for several years and a yoga and wellness teacher, accompanied by his group, spent an afternoon at the Amed centre in order to learn about Anak and give the children their first yoga lesson. TRASH HERO

Annie is Australian and lives in Amed eight months of the year. She is Anak's support in the village and regularly organises TRASH TO TREASURE through her network and friends. Her goal is to have people pick up garbage and bring it to the TRASH TO TREASURE store where the collection is weighed. Depending on the weight of waste collected, residents receive tokens that allow them to obtain second-hand clothing/toys/accessories, etc. acquired through donations. This year, the event took place on 29 April 2018 in the centre of Amed thanks to its volunteers, the Anak team and the children who participated in setting it up. Anak is thrilled to be involved in such environmental protection initiatives with the local community.





The first annual Anak seminar was held on 17 and 18 December 2017 at the new LILA CITA SAWAN centre. The field coordinators and the administrative team from the Ubud office met over these two days to discuss the association's procedures and the cases of

some children, and to develop teaching tools. They also shared experiences in an aim to improve operations at each centre and to work better towards helping Anak's godchildren.

STUDY TOUR thanks to J. L. BENAZRA and his online collection



Once again, the Study Tour became part of Anak's 2018 programme, thanks to a kitty set up by Jean Luc Benazra, who has been an Anak godfather since 2016. The funds were used to finance the annual outing to Bedugul Park on 18 June 2018 and to

hold small competitions among the 200 children sponsored by the association. It was a memorable day filled with laughter, and you can now watch it on YouTube under the following name «Yayasan ANAK - Study Tour 18 juin 2018».



From 1 to 24 May 2018, Anak's centres in Sawan and Amed took pleasure in welcoming five young people from AIDE MONDIALE, an association of the ISC-Paris business school, for one month of games and workshops in

intensive English. On joining the centres, Zainab, Inès, Bilel, Boris and Wael made the children very happy. They introduced not only challenges, songs, drawings and theatre plays, but also swimming and sports and spent unforgettable moments together. AIDE MONDIALE also provided academic material and donated 1,500 euros to finance the LILA CITA SAWAN centre. After they had returned to France, the five young people were also able to present their mission to our new partner school in Saint Cloud and brought the French children the first exchange of drawings between these two schools. We thank the AIDE MONDIALE team for this great energy and look forward to the next visit of volunteers in May 2019!

DC2 construction has begun

Following the purchase of land in Singaraja in April 2017 and its clearing by students in December 2017, the first work on DHARMA CITA 2 was begun in February 2018 by installing the wastewater evacuation system and constructing the outer wall. The next step, scheduled for September 2018, is to construct the building, depending on the funds raised.



Ni Kadek Srimaryani born in 1997, is from the village of Panji Anom. The association has been helping Srimaryani since 2004 when she was in her first year of primary school at SD Negeri 2 Panji Anom. She is now studying accounting at the Singaraja university of economics and lives at ANAK's residence in Singaraja.

I Gede Suardana was born in 1998. He has been sponsored since 2008 when he was in his 4th year of primary school. From Pakisan village, he has been living in Jimbaran since July 2017 and is currently in his second year of studies in International Business Management at Bali Politeknik University.
